

Since the launch of the **United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (DESD, 2005-2014)**, more and more individuals and organizations around the world have been implementing Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) with different focuses and approaches (e.g. Biodiversity, Climate Change, Gender Equality, Poverty Reduction, Water, etc.)

In 2014 the **UNESCO World Conference on ESD** which marks the end of the Decade will be held in Aichi-Nagoya and Okayama, Japan. Using the motto "Learning Today for a Sustainable Future", the Conference will celebrate the achievements of the Decade, identify lessons learnt and set the stage for the future of Education for Sustainable Development. It will also showcase initiatives, actors, networks and ideas that the Decade has stimulated. Such examples from all over the world will help to generate future action.

Okayama City will be the venue of a set of Stakeholder Meetings, which will bring together key ESD stakeholder groups such as UNESCO ASPnet*1 schools, and youth representatives, and RCEs*2 from 4 to 8 November 2014. The Stakeholder Meetings will provide input and recommendations to the World Conference on ESD, beginning two days later on 10 November 2014 in Aichi-Nagoya.
