[Traffic field trial on Nishigawa line, Prefectural office street]

On both 3rd and 4th of May on Golden Week, traffic field trial aiming migratory improvement of the center city was taken place at Nishigawa line and prefectural office street to create an easy-to-walk space for pedestrians. I participated on 4th.

I had been worried that it might be postponed because previous day's weather forecast said it would be rain on 4^{th} , however, traffic field trial could make it somehow and I was relived (I suppose the person in charge was extremely worried though...).

On the day, I moved with my wife around AEON mall through Prefectural office street, Nishigawa line, and then walked Prefectural Office Street again toward Tenmaya, Omotecho direction from around 1 pm. I got an impression that everywhere was filled with more people than usual. I believe we fully obtained effects of generating footfall.

In particular, I saw children relaxed and played without a fear of traffic accident and passersby were with full of smile at Nishigawa Line that became pedestrian's paradise as a first project.
