[UNESCO World Conference on ESD has finished]

Hello. This is Omori, Mayor of Okayama City.

Approximately 3,000 people from 97 countries and regions attended "UNESCO World Conference on ESD" in Okayama City which began from "Kominkan-CLC International Conference on ESD promotion" in October and this session over more than one month came to an end on 17th November.

In a series of meetings, we widely spread the ESD initiatives such as environmental protection and international understanding rooted in the region of Okayama, as a model of ESD dissemination (Okayama model) in the future of the world and has received a high evaluation.

I rethought that Okayama city has to exhibit leadership to work on the promotion of ESD in the future so that ESD will be world common culture.

Above all, I think it was particularly a big achievement that we arranged "Okayama commitment" in the "Kominkan-CLC International Conference on ESD promotion" of October, and "Okayama declaration" in the "Global RCE Conference" of November 4th to 7th and to be able to leave Okayama's mark in history on the stage of the United Nations.

In addition, in the high school forum of "International Forum on UNESCO ASP net", a joint declaration was adopted to solve global challenges such as environmental destruction and economic disparity beyond the differences in language and nationality. Young people's powers are incredible.

Besides, it seems that people from abroad had a good impression on Okayama and were very touched by our hospitality and communication that each citizen including volunteers and children had a talk face-to-face with ESD officials.

Frankly speaking, I am relieved to have finished a series of conferences, however, I would like to further refine the hospitality and information dissemination to get many people from the world come to Okayama in the future.
